County Supervisor Maureen Caddigan announced today that she will seek another 4-year term as a member of the Prince William Board of County Supervisor to a standing-room only crowd at Giorgio's Restaurant in Montclair. Mrs. Caddigan served for 7 years as a member of the County School Board, serving as its Chairman for 3 of those years. She was elected in 1991 to the Board of Supervisors representing the Dumfries (Potomac) Magisterial District. She is now serving as its Vice Chairman for the 4th time. In addition to her County responsibilities Caddigan serves as a Commissioner of the Potomac Rappahannock Transportation Commission, a Commissioner of The Virginia Railway Express, a member of the Board of Directors of the Virginia Association of Counties and as the Co-Chairman of the Quantico Growth Management Committee (BRAC).

Supervisor Caddigan has been the recipient of several state level assignments from Governors Allen, Gilmore and Warner as well as an appointment to the Congressional Medicare Task force by Congressman Tom Davis.

Locally Caddigan has become known for getting things done. Her promises made have been promises kept. She was key to acquiring the land for the National Museum of the Marine Corps. Her efforts resulted in a remake of Route 1 in Triangle as well as bridging and sidewalks on Fuller Heights Road. She has been directly responsible for the development of a County Park in Triangle and a new Library in Montclair. She has led efforts to support our police and firefighters and has been known as a teacher advocate throughout her tenure.

Responding to questions Mrs. Caddigan stated "I have made education, public safety and transportation top priorities while serving on the Board of County Supervisors and I pledge to continue to do so. We must continue to provide a school system that delivers the best possible education for all of our students. Similarly, we must ensure adequate funding and proper staffing levels for our police, fire and rescue personnel to maintain a high quality of life for our citizens. We must continue with programmed improvements in our road infrastructure and the provision of excellent public transportation systems."

In addition to her public responsibilities, Supervisor Caddigan is a member of the VFW Ladies auxiliary and the Board of Directors of the Boys & Girls Club where she has been a twice recipient of the Prestigious Woman and Youth Award. She serves as the liaison between the County and both the Quantico Marine Corps Base and the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation. She is a member of the Board of Directors of Azalea Charities.
